# A MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR AND THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

BUILDING A PROTECTIVE COMMUNITY FOR A WORLD FREE OF SEXUAL VIOLENCE

We can state without a doubt that 2017–2018 was a productive year for the Marie-Vincent Foundation! The entire team contributed to building major projects that are very promising for the future of children and adolescents.

Those projects are more relevant than ever. Since the #metoo movement, the Marie-Vincent Foundation demands for services have increased significantly.

#### >> NEW SERVICES FOR ADOLESCENTS

In a major step for the Foundation, in April 2017 we welcomed our first teenage clients who were victims of sexual violence. Just as for the children, all the services they need are now available in a single place: police interview, medical exam, and psychosocial and socio-legal services. As such, these young people are supported from the moment they disclose until the end of their treatment. Their parents can also find support throughout the process.

New therapy rooms and a reception area were set up to meet their needs.

As well, thanks to funding obtained through the Stratégie d'action jeunesse (youth action strategy) from the Québec government's Secrétariat à la jeunesse (youth secretariat), our service offering will be enhanced to better respond to more complex issues, such as sexual exploitation, sexual violence in romantic relationships and online sexual violence.

### >>> PREVENTING SEXUAL VIOLENCE

We also had a productive year in the area of prevention! After analyzing needs in various communities for young children aged from birth to five and for teens, the team set about creating prevention tools.

For young children, we are developing books, a game, short videos, and kits for parents and front-line workers. These tools will be tailored to the developmental stage of children aged from birth to five. They focus on sex education and education about egalitarian relationships. They will be rolled out in communities throughout 2018.

As for our project to prevent online sexual violence, after having surveyed teens from three different school boards, we were able to discern the prevalence of online sexual violence and its consequences in the school setting. This helped us raise awareness about the issue among teens, high school administrations, teachers, professionals and parents.

Young people also began to create prevention campaigns in their schools. These campaigns take various forms: short animated videos, posters and more.

#### GROWING OUR IMPACT

During the year, we embarked on a reflection process on the impact of the Foundation's services and the influence we would like to have in the community in the future. This led us to work on an impact statement and a social transformation diagram that will be disseminated throughout 2018.

We already know that the therapy provided at Marie-Vincent has a real impact on the developmental trajectory of children and adolescents who have been sexually assaulted. Now, we want young victims of sexual violence and children who have sexual behaviour problems across the province to be able to receive the services they need.

For this reason, we are now pursuing a reflection process about various models for growing our impact and our services, both in terms of prevention and training and in the area of services to victims and their families.

In the coming years, the Marie-Vincent Foundation will continue to support young victims and their families. We also want to help create a protective community for all children so that, one day, they can live in a world free of sexual violence. We can create this community by rallying our partners and the public around children and adolescents. Together, we can prevent sexual violence by focusing on education about healthy sexuality and egalitarian relationships.

Also, by training the adults who spend time with young people, we can better equip them to prevent sexual violence and support young victims.

Thanks to all the employees of the Marie-Vincent Foundation, our partners and our generous donors, we will be able to achieve our dream of building a world free of sexual violence. We extend our warmest thanks to them all.

# WE DREAM OF A WORLD FREE OF SEXUAL VIOLENCE TOWARDS CHILDREN AND ADOLESCENTS.


Every child deserves to live a happy life, to grow up healthy, to thrive and to reach his or her full potential.


# OUR MISSION

We mobilize the victims, their parents, governmental, financial partners and those working with young victims of sexual violence, to help the cause and eliminate sexual violence.

The Lantern | Awacic project

#### >> THE LANTERN | AWACIC PROJECT

Since summer 2016, the Marie-Vincent Foundation has worked to create a project focusing on education about healthy sexuality and egalitarian relationships for children aged from birth to five and the adults in their lives.

The name "Lantern" was born from the idea that it is adults' responsibility to **shine a light** on education about healthy sexuality and egalitarian relationships for young children and to protect them from sexual violence from the time they are very young. In Atikamekw communities, the project is called Awacic, which means "**small being of light**," a reference to children aged from birth to five who carry light and hope within themselves.

We devoted the 2017–2018 year to finalizing needs assessment with communities and partners, and to developing tools for young children and the people in their lives them: books, a game, short videos, kits for parents and front-line workers, and more. These tools will be implemented in communities throughout 2018.

Funded by the Ministère de la Justice du Québec, the project aims to better understand the phenomenon of online sexual violence, which is growing quickly, and to take action to prevent it.

In its first year, the project helped us shed light on the prevalence and consequences of online sexual violence in school settings and to raise awareness about the issue among young people, high school administrations, teachers, professionals and parents.


In 2017, the project was implemented in three schools in the Montréal, Laval and Montérégie regions. Surveys and focus groups were held for more than 500 students. Within each school, a prevention committee made up of motivated, creative young people took part in developing a concrete, original prevention and action plan to raise awareness of the issue among their peers.

523 young people were surveyed via a questionnaire

50 young people took part in focus groups

In 2018, the project was renewed for a second year. Two additional schools joined the project and a prevention kit will be developed to help schools implement the project themselves.

This kit, developed in collaboration with the schools, will be available all over Québec. It will help schools to better understand the issue and prevent problems, and also to know how to intervene in this type of situation.



# THE CHAIRE'S ACTIVITIES


## 2017-2018 HIGHLIGHTS

The goal of the Chaire interuniversitaire Marie-Vincent is to develop cutting-edge expertise in Québec in the areas of the screening and treatment of sexual abuse of children and teens.

Once again this year, our researchers made their mark. Martine Hébert was elected a Fellow of the Royal Society of Canada (Academy of the Arts and Humanities, 2017). This is the greatest Canadian honour that can be conferred on a university researcher working in the area of the arts, letters and sciences. She was also awarded the Prix d'excellence 2017 en recherche – Apport exceptionnel (2017 award for excellence in research – exceptional contribution) by the Faculté des sciences humaines (faculty of humanities) at Université du Québec à Montréal.

- >>> 27 master's and doctoral students are working on research projects related to Marie-Vincent's activities and clientele.
- >> 3 of them earned their degrees this year.
- Isabelle Daignault and Mireille Cyr edited a special edition of the journal Criminologie, entitled L'agression sexuelle commise sur des mineurs: les victimes, les auteurs (sexual assault committed against minors: the victims, the perpetrators).
- The researchers, their students and colleagues produced 13 book chapters and 56 scholarly articles.
- >>> The researchers were invited to 12 conferences for various audiences (judges, prosecutors, child advocacy centres, mental-health workers).
- The researchers and their students gave 54 talks about their work at national and international academic gatherings.
- 5 events were held for Marie-Vincent staff to disseminate the results and impacts of ongoing research work.

### **PORTRAIT OF A PARTNER:**

# Avenir d'enfants

Avenir d'enfants is a major donor to the Marie-Vincent Foundation. Thanks to the organization, we were able to launch a sexual violence prevention project for young children aged from birth to age 5. This project focuses on education about sex and egalitarian relationships. We are pleased to introduce you to Avenir d'enfants and to its Executive Director, Julie Dostaler, in the following interview.

### >> WHAT IS AVENIR D'ENFANTS?

Avenir d'enfants is an organization with thousands of local, regional and provincial partners across Québec. Our shared mission is to contribute to the overall development of kids aged from birth to 5, to give each and every one of them the chance for a good start in life. Our approach is ecosystem-based, meaning that our actions don't target just the children, but also their families and the communities they live in. These three aspects are closely linked.

# >> WAY FOCUS ON KIDS AGED F

The early childhood period offers unique windows of opportunity to prevent problems that might have repercussions later in life, such as dropping out of school, poverty, and social and health inequalities. The first years of a child's

life are the most active ones for learning. For Avenir d'enfants and our thousands of partners, seizing these opportunities means acting on factors that protect early childhood, mobilizing not only child-specific resources but also those for parents and for the communities the children live in.

# >> WAY START EDUCATING CHILDREN AGED FROM BIRTH TO AGE 5 ABOUT SEX AND EGA-LITARIAN RELATIONSHIPS?

It's terrible, but we know that one out of 5 girls and one out of 10 boys will be sexually assaulted in childhood. This trauma can have many impacts on their life journey, for instance on their academic success, their sense of personal safety, their confidence and their self-esteem. So it's essential to act on the risk factors associated with sexual assault and to aim to eliminate them.

The process of providing education about sex and egalitarian relationships to children aged from birth to age 5 offers a prevention tool in the aim of reducing the risks of sexual mistreatment and abuse. Beyond that, it's an excellent way to strengthen kids' social and emotional skills from a young age.

# >> WHAT APPEALED TO YOU ABOUT THE PROJECT WITH MARIE-VINCENT FOUNDATION?

First, we were aware that Marie-Vincent Foundation was well known for its expertise and understanding of the issues related to sexual violence toward children. It's a credible organization and we had a strong interest in partnering with it to develop a prevention project for young children.

For children, protection factors such as growing up in a stimulating and safe environment and maintaining healthy and balanced relationships with the people around them are essential to harmonious development.

I believe that preventing sexual assault on children is everyone's business. This project feels innovative and inspiring because it relies on the contribution of a variety of local, regional and national partners, including Indigenous groups, in an approach that includes working with children and their families as well as with community workers and decision-makers.

# >> What's your hope for the project's future?

Our greatest wish is to help put into place an approach that identifies truly effective practices toward preventing the sexual assault of young children, and for this approach to snowball. We hope the project will be rolled out across the whole province.

The multiple partnerships will serve to mobilize the highest possible number of contributors to help provide education about sex and egalitarian relationships to all our young children and their parents.

What's your wish for
young children
in the coming years?

In the coming years, I would like to see education about sex and egalitarian relationships become part of the education curriculum for all young children, for there to be no more taboos about this subject, for it to become normal to talk about it.

Ultimately, I would wish that nobody—and certainly no children—should ever have to use the #metoo hashtag. The personal and social consequences are too heavy. I want all of society from now on to use the hashtag #neveragain and to take on the mission of protecting the most innocent among us: young children.

# Dr. Jean-Yves Frappier

Dr. Jean-Yves Frappier is a pediatrician specializing in adolescent medicine and the maltreatment of minors. He has been Head of the Social Pediatric division at CHU Sainte-Justine since 2002, and was Head of Adolescent Medicine from 2000 to 2012. Since 2012, he has been Head of Pediatrics at CHU Sainte-Justine and Director of the Pediatrics Department at Université de Montréal, where he is a professor of pediatrics. He was President of the Canadian Paediatric Society and has been President of the Montréal Assault Prevention Centre since 1997. His extensive research focuses on sexuality, sexual assault, sexually transmitted infections, eating disorders and physical and mental health in adolescents, particularly marginalized and at-risk youth.

He has helped create the range of services that the Marie-Vincent Foundation provides for children and teens who have been sexually assaulted.

>>> What was your role in creating the services provided by Marie-Vincent?

Before the Centre d'expertise Marie-Vincent was created, the Foundation consulted me to learn about what children need in terms of services. The Foundation wanted to provide services to children who were victims of maltreatment. They conducted a needs analysis and consulted a group of professionals, of which I was a part. We established at that time that services were needed for children who were the victims of sexual assault.

I then contributed to the project's development, concept and services with the Foundation Board's Chair, Jean Saint-Onge, Ad. E., and the Centre's Executive Director, Lucie Joyal. From the start, I was part of various working groups, issue tables and the partners' group.

>> What motivated you to get involved with the Marie-Vincent Foundation?

When it approached me, in the early 2000s, I had been working for 23 years in the field of child protection and more specifically in the area of sexual assault against children and teens. It was my field of expertise and my area of interest. So it was totally natural that I would get involved. I of course thought the project was of great interest.

As well, at the time we were thinking about the concept of the Centre d'expertise, in 2003, we were talking more and more about interdisciplinarity. The idea of bringing together multiple

partners to help young victims made the project even more pertinent. And since sexual assault necessarily involves partners from different fields, such as police departments, the justice system, youth protection, the health sector and community groups, this made the project innovative and motivating.

# >> What is your wish for

#### the Marie-Vincent Foundation?

First, I want the Foundation to always have the funding it needs to provide services for children and teens who are victims of sexual violence.


Then, I hope it will always be able to rally partners to work together to build, make concerted efforts and collaborate.

It is not always easy to break down silos. Partners have different kinds of training, different visions, different imperatives, and we are all very busy in our own fields. So we need to talk to each other regularly, and learn to understand each other to better help child and teen victims. It's an everyday kind of work that demands constant attention. It's a bit like agriculture or gardening. To reap a good harvest, you need to constantly work, day after day, year after year. To never lose sight of this necessary collaboration and concerted work, meaning the major issue in working with victims of sexual abuse, I think we will always need to hold on to this idea of constant attention to our communications, our relationships, our mutual understanding, and our common objective: the well-being of our children and teens. So my wish is that the Foundation foster this constant attention.

>> You have dedicated your career to the health of children and teens. What is your greatest dream for our young people?

My dream is for every child and teen to be able to develop to his or her full potential, safe from all forms of violence, including sexual violence.

Evidently – because this is a very big dream – I first dream for there to be fewer victims. And since there are still victims, I wish for them to all receive the high-quality services that will help them find their way back to harmonious development.


