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

Justine dashes into the kitchen.


– Nassim... What are you doing here?

GUIDELINES FOR DISCUSSION

- Did you notice that Justine likes to play with her friend Ling? Can boys and girls play together? Who do you like to play with? What do you like to do with your friends? *Invite the children to identify a friend of the opposite sex with whom they like to play.*
- Milo dresses up and Justine builds a city with cars. Are there games and toys for girls and for boys? Tell me about the games and toys you like to play with. *Emphasize nonstereotyped games for girls and boys. Mention that tastes are different for everyone, regardless of sex.*
- Did you notice that Justine was scared and was feeling upset when she was looking for Marvin outside in the dark? Do boys also get scared or upset? What other emotions do you know about? Can girls and boys feel the same emotions? *Emphasize that children all have the same emotions, no matter their sex.*
- Justine's doll Lily is a superheroine. Do you know any superheroines? Girls are brave and strong! Tell me about a girl you know who is brave or strong.
